Artist Statement

The work in *Further Fauxfacts* comes from an ongoing series that uses a queer lens to speculate on the physical artefacts contemporary society might leave behind for the humanities of a dystopian future. As AI raises new questions about just how virtual life may become, and global warming threatens the servers and wi-fi signals we depend on to access our online lives, these 'fauxfacts' consider a world where the internet and its digital culture no longer exists.

Ingmar looks to ancient Greco-Roman art and culture for inspiration, a period when mythology was filled with stories of transformation and fluid identities. The ancient Greeks and Romans had a complex, and often more open understanding of non-heteronormative desire and gender roles compared to later Western societies shaped by Christianity.

By alluding to decayed and ruined Greco Roman artefacts (such as frescos, ancient tablets, and amphoras) Ingmar's fauxfacts speak to the loss of queer histories through time, and the act of reclaiming and reconstructing these stories in both the present and the future.
